

Obtaining Graduate School References:

First, speak with your references to find out if they are willing to do this for you and that they can write you a *positive* reference for graduate study. If so, offer them this follow up information so they can be specific in their letters. Usually an outline format is fine.

Give them all appropriate forms or instructions, including an addressed, stamped envelope if appropriate.

<u>Send faculty a thank you note and be sure to let them know the outcome!</u> They will probably <u>feel invested in your success and be wondering what happened.</u>
