

SUMMER CAMP PART-TIME INSTRUCTOR POSITION

The Summer Camp Instructor will teach science lessons, facilitate summer programming, and mentor K-5 students attending summer camp, empowering students from City Heights to explore science, mathematics, and the natural world.

Responsibilities/Deliverables:

- Deliver hands-on STEM lessons at the <u>Living Lab</u> and facilitate student field experiences to local beaches and wetlands.
- Facilitate program coordination such as supply management, student management, student support, and summer camp lesson implementation (large group activities, science of health, dissections, lab and field experiments).
- Support with camp logistics (daily check-in and check-out, parent communication, schedule support).
- Enthusiastically engage students in programming designed to foster curiosity, achievement, and exploration.
- Lead camp group of 8-10 K-5 students weekly.
- Support and mentor college-age fellows as assistant instructors and mentors.

Requirements:

• College graduate with a bachelor's degree, some college completed, or working to complete a degree.

Qualifications:

- Interest in STEM, conservation, youth development, education, recreation, social justice, or non-profit fields.
- Experience leading groups in classroom and field settings.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the community we serve, such as graduating from our programs, living in the community of City Heights, or living in or from a community similar to City Heights.
- Dedicated to the concept of promoting equal opportunity for under-represented students.
- Ability to work as part of team in a fast paced, dynamic work environment.
- Ability to walk and stand for long periods of time, lift and carry heavy or awkward items approximately 25-40lbs.
- Enthusiasm and positive energy that engages K-5 students.
- Knowledge of local marine habitats, flora, and fauna.
- Successfully pass state fingerprinting check (Live Scan).
