Extended Opportunity Programs & Services



EOPS is a California State funded program established to provide special recruitment, retention, and transition services to eligible students. EOPS assists students through academic support and financial assistance. The services of EOPS are designed to give students individualized attention and support to optimize their opportunity for success.

Eligibility:

- California resident
- Enrolled full-time (12+ units)
- Completion of fewer than 70 degree-applicable college units
- Meet specific educational criteria
- Meet specific income criteria

Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education



CARE is a program for single parent students who receive CalWORKs cash aid and meet other eligibility criteria. Services are designed to provide additional support and assist students to attain economic self-sufficiency by earning a certificate, associate degree, or transfer to a four-year college or university. **Eligibility:**

- Eligible for the EOPS Program
- At least 18 years of age
- Single head of household
- Receiving CalWORKs cash aid assistance
- Parent/legal guardian of at least one child under age 18

Cooperative Agencies Foster Youth Educational Support (CAFYES)



NextUp is a supplemental program of EOPS. Its purpose is to support the educational goals and well-being of current and former foster youth and to provide "over and above" support services to help them overcome obstacles while pursuing their higher education and career goals.

Eligibility:

- Eligible for the EOPS Program
- Current/former foster youth in CA whose dependency/wardship was established or continued by the court on/after the youth's 16th birthday
- Under the age of 26 at the beginning of the academic year
- Enrolled in at least nine (9) units

Summer Readiness Program

The Summer Readiness Program is an 8-week summer orientation



for first-time college students. Students are enrolled in a Learning Community consisting of English and Personal Growth classes and participate in social engagement activities to support their transition from high school to college. A separate application is required.

Eligibility:

- Eligible for the EOPS Program
- Meet current year CCPG/BOGW eligibility
- High school diploma or GED required
