## **SCHOLARSHIP MARATHON**

### WHAT IS IT?

This all-day event encourages students to share confirmations of completed scholarship, college, and FAFSA applications, for a chance to win hourly gift card raffles, and to be entered for a \$1000 tuition scholarship from College Greenlight and Cappex!

This year, Community Based Organizations (CBO) have a chance to win raffles as well! The submission form will include a space for students to identify their CBO or counseling organization. Each submission will enter the organization into a drawing for 1 of 2 \$500 donations from College Greenlight!

### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

- Submit proof of "unique" applications. College Greenlight will use these entries as raffle tickets and select a raffle winner each hour of the marathon.
- Entries can include:
  - Scholarship applications
  - College applications
  - Personal statements/essays
  - Campus visits
  - An organized college list on College Greenlight
  - Essentially any proof of college access activity

## **HOOVER SCHOLARSHIPS**

### SCHOLARSHIP STRATEGY

- Aim for about \$10,000 in scholarships, which means applying to at least 20 scholarships.
- Consider criteria that is as targeted as possible (for small applicant pools):
  - Local is better than national (order of preference: Hoover, City Heights, San Diego, California, US)
  - Ethnicity/Religion/Gender
  - First-generation
  - Sports/Music
- Ideal scholarships:
  - Multi-year awards
  - Cash-in-pocket or physical prizes (ie: check, laptop, car, etc.)
- Scholarship sources:
  - Hoover's counselor google classroom
  - CAMP newsletter
  - College Access Portal

### STEPHEN EFFRON SCHOLARSHIP

The <u>Effron Scholarship Program</u> at Hoover High School was established in memory of Helen and Sol Price's nephew, Stephen Effron, who had attended Hoover High School. Only current Hoover High students are eligible.

#### Scholarship Details (depending on financial need):

- Up to \$4,000 a year, for up to 5 years, if you go to a 4-year university
- Up to \$2,000 a year, for up to 3 years, if you go to a community college or vocational program
- Multiple scholarships will be awarded Scholarship recipients receive mentoring and networking opportunities throughout the program

#### **Application Requirements:**

We look for applicants who are succeeding in school, have a financial need, and demonstrate qualities essential to college success, including responsibility, time management and prioritization. These qualities can be shown through extracurricular activities, volunteering, working or home responsibilities. In addition:

- Students applying for a university scholarship must have a minimum 10-12<sup>th</sup> grade weighted GPA without PE of 3.0
- Students applying for a community college/vocational scholarship must have a minimum 10-12<sup>th</sup> grade weighted GPA without PE of 2.0



### **HOW TO APPLY**

- Completed Application
- First page only of your financial aid reports (SAR/CAR)
  - From FAFSA and Cal Grant
  - This page should show your name and EFC (print online to get both on same page)
- Personal Statement
- Two Letters of Recommendation
- Official Transcript unofficial transcripts will not be accepted
- Free Write
- Finalist Interview
