FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID

FAFSA Overview

- Never pay for FAFSA help or filing
- Must fill out FAFSA to have access to any other financial aid sources (i.e.: state aid, institutional aid)
- Must first create an FSA ID for student AND <u>parent</u> (known as "Contributor")
- Parents will be cued to add their financial data to the student's FAFSA through an email link using their parent FSA ID
 - Email MUST be different from student email
- Apply every year you need student aid, and must maintain at least part-time status in order to qualify for most types of financial aid

FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID

- FAFSA calculates "Student Aid Index" (SAI)
 - Can be a negative number
- The "SAI" is how schools determine financial aid packages based on their cost of attendance
- #1 error in filling out the FAFSA is mismatching NAME and SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER from school records
- FAFSA does NOT share application information with any agency other than the schools you indicate you want your information sent to.
 - Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)
 - There is no penalty for being honest and accurate

CAL GRANT

California Student Aid Commission (CSAC)

FILLING OUT THE CAL GRANT APPLICATION

- All that is required to apply is your GPA and FAFSA.
 - Hoover sends GPAs no student action needed.
 - Must complete FAFSA before receiving a tentative award.
- Commission produces a "California Aid Report" or "CAR" that summarizes tentative award. To access this information, simply create an account with WebGrants 4 Students at https://mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov/
 - Will use language like "preliminary" or "not yet awarded"
 - Submit CAR to Isabel
- Can be eligible for multiple awards.
- Financial awards only available toward California colleges

TYPES OF AWARDS

Eligibility: GPA + FAFSA

Cal Grant A

GPA Minimum: 3.0

Award Coverage:

- Up to 4 years of tuition & fees

Cal Grant B

GPA Minimum: 2.0

Award Coverage:

- Tuition & fees for years 2-4
- Access Award for up to 4 years (~\$1, 672)

Cal Grant C

No GPA Requirement

Vocational/ technical/ occupational programs

ADDITIONAL CSAC AWARDS

- Middle Class Scholarship MCS provides undergraduate students with family income up to \$184,000 and assets up to \$184,000 a scholarship to attend University of California (UC) or California State University (CSU) campuses.
- California Chafee Grant available to any applicant who is or was in foster care between the ages of 16-18.
- Law Enforcement Personnel Dependents Grant provides need-based educational grants to dependents and spouses of employees who lost their lives in the line of duty or were totally disabled
- Golden State Teacher Grant for students who are currently enrolled in a teacher preparation program to earn a credential in the high need field of special education

WHAT TO EXPECT NEXT?

FINANCIAL AID AWARD

- Receive your FAFSA Submission Summary from the Office of Federal Student Aid (email confirmation or FAFSA account) – this is where you find your SAI. Send to Isabel.
- Receive your California Aid Report from the California Student Aid Commission. Send to Isabel.
- FSA and CSAC send your SAI and preliminary award, respectively, to each school indicated on your FAFSA, and the financial aid award itself comes from each college; every school will offer a unique award package.

FINANCIAL AID AWARD

- Schools cannot offer a financial aid award package until they have your FAFSA.
- You are not required to accept the award in its entirety; you can pick and choose the aid you want to receive; awards include:
 - Grants
 - Loans
 - Scholarships
 - Work study*
